Sacrament of Baptism

An essential part of the commitment is regular attendance at Sunday Mass. Baptisms are usually held on two Sundays every month. Please contact the parish office for a Baptismal package.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Couples planning to be married should contact the parish one year in advance. They must also attend a Marriage Preparation Course prior to entering marriage. If either party has previously gone through any form of civil divorce or religious marriage with another person, please notify the priest as soon as possible as the priest is not permitted to set a wedding date until the Bishop's Office has been contacted.

2023 PARISH SHARELIFE CAMPAIGNS. ShareLifeUPDATE - PARISH GOAL: \$154,700

We have now entered the final month of the 2023 ShareLife Parish Campaign. To date, **St. Francis of Assisi parishioners have contributed \$140, 611.95,** which is 91% of our parish goal. Thank you for your tremendous generosity at a time when so many are having trouble making ends meet. If you are still able to contribute to this year's campaign, please do so by the end of the calendar year. A donor in the Archdiocese has agreed to match all monetary donations up to \$500,000 contributed by December 31, 2023.

Since April 2022, there has been a 38% increase in food bank usage throughout Ontario. One in 10 people in the GTA are now turning to a food bank for food assistance. ShareLife has recognized this need and has recently allocated \$500,000 (in addition to \$120,000 previously allocated) to support food and meal programs in our parishes and agencies. Seventeen programs associated with our parishes have received funds from ShareLife, and another twelve organizations serving or distributing food also received funds. The provision of food is one way ShareLife is making an impact.

When we consider refugees arriving in Canada being helped to settle, find employment, and register children for school, families receiving counselling through a Catholic Family Services agency, or persons dealing with addiction receiving help from St. Michael's Homes or Good Shepherd Ministries, we know our contributions to ShareLife are truly making a difference.

In the gospel for the Solemnity of Christ the King, Jesus gave an eternal reward to those who saw that he was hungry and gave him food, thirsty and gave him drink, a stranger and took him in, naked and gave him clothes, sick and visited him, and in prison and went to him. Our support for ShareLife shows that we recognize the presence of Christ in our suffering brothers and sisters, and we want to help them any way we can. Thank you for doing your part to live the gospel message!
